

citizenM 'proof of vaccination' policy Netherlands

What you need to know

From the **25th September**, there are new Covid-19 rules in place, set out by the government of the Netherlands. You will find details of all the rules on the Covid-19 section of the official website: www.government.nl.

All visitors and registered guests who are over 13 years old must show a CTB ([coronatoegangsbewijs](#)) to use the public areas of the hotel. All visitors and registered guests who are over 14 years old must also show government-issued ID (identity card, passport or driver's licence). The CTB can be:

- proof of vaccination on the DCC app (EU QR code), or the Dutch CoronaCheck app, or paper certificates from the UK, USA and the rest of the world
- proof of recovery – a positive COVID test which is at least 11 days old and maximum 180 days old
- negative test result no older than 24 hours

Can I stay in the hotel without any of the above?

Yes, but you will not be able to use any public areas of the hotel. You will need to stay in your room and consume all food and beverages there too.

Which vaccines are accepted?

The vaccine you received must have been approved by the European Medicines Agency (EMA) or be on the Emergency Use Listing of the World Health Organization (WHO). This is currently the case for the following vaccines:

- Astra Zeneca - Japan (Vaxzevria)
- Astra Zeneca - Australia (Vaxzevria)
- Astra Zeneca-SK Bio (Vaxzevria)
- Pfizer-BioNTech COVID-19 Vaccine - United States of America
- Pfizer/BioNTech (Comirnaty)
- Johnson & Johnson ((COVID-19 Vaccine) Janssen)
- Moderna (Spikevax)
- Serum Institute of India (Covishield)
- Sinopharm BIBP
- Sinovac
